### ***You're Invited...***

The King County Law Library's Seattle library moved back to the Courthouse from temporary quarters in the County Administration Building at the end of September. We're planning to celebrate our return to the 6<sup>th</sup> floor with an Open House on Thursday, October 28<sup>th</sup> from 4:30 p.m. until 6 p.m. We are issuing an open invitation to the community to join us for this event.

The Open House will provide an opportunity to formally recognize all who played a role in the library's 85<sup>th</sup> Anniversary Campaign effort to raise the funds necessary to renovate the library's space. In particular, we will recognize the role played by a variety of volunteers and key supporters. At the Open House, we will unveil the plaque and donor book of names that highlight the more than 125 individuals and firms who made gifts to the fundraising effort. Tours of the remodeled library will highlight the new furnishings, products and services provided to enhance the usability of the library's space.

### **Hein Online - New Legal Database in the Library**

The Library is now subscribing to HeinOnline. HeinOnline contains full text images of law reviews, Federal Register, U.S. treaties and the official U.S. Supreme Court decisions. The law review collection contains hundreds of law reviews. Most titles have complete coverage from volume one to current issues. The Federal Register library begins with volume one. The U.S. treaties libraries contains not only the text of currently in force treaties, but also expired treaties and yet to be published treaties. The U.S. Supreme Court library contains the official bound volumes, and the preliminary prints. HeinOnline allows for full text searching of all pages contained in their service. ## Washington Digital Archives

The Secretary of State opened a new government digital archives built from the ground up – a facility designed to salvage critical, public records from local and state government that are born electronic. Included among the collections are the papers of each governor, legislative records, court records, records from all state agencies, and all of the "official records" of the state, including governors' proclamations, executive orders, election results, and the laws as passed and signed.
