New KCLL Web Site!

We're very excited to announce the launch of the Library's newly revised web site www.kcll.org. While our web address remains the same, both the look and the feel of the site have been changed to make it easier to find information. We've spiffed up our front-page graphics and added the tag line "without access to information, there is no justice."

Beyond new colors and graphics, we've enhanced the searching functionality of our site by adding an internal search engine. Internal search engines are becoming a familiar feature in corporate and government sites. We're excited to be able to add this service.

We've added a new feature that will automatically redirect visitors who've book marked favorite pages on our old site - to the new location within the revised site. We also added a custom error page feature. Now a site visitor who types the address for a web page that doesn't exist will see an error page that provides suggestions for finding the desired information rather than receiving the standard "page not found" message. This feature works especially well in situations where the user has made a typing error in entering a web address.

The Library's web page has become one of our primary service and outreach tools. We will continue to add new features in the months ahead. We also encourage visitors to the site to let us know what we can do to make the site a more useful research resource for them.
