Features of Our New Courthouse Space

In October, we returned to the sixth floor of the King County Courthouse. With funds from our successful 85th Anniversary Campaign, we improved the downtown Seattle library in a number of ways. We added new computer carrels. We created casual seating areas with new furniture. We adjusted the book collection so that all materials are now arranged in a single, logical sequence. We adjusted aisles and stack areas so that all areas are accessible to wheelchair patrons. We enlarged our conference rooms and added amenities like whiteboards. Wi-fi and Westlaw Now Available at the RJC

The Regional Justice Center Library is now a wi-fi "hot spot" for wireless Internet access! There is no fee or password required to access the wireless network. Due to the wide variety of laptops and operating systems, Library staff members may not be able to provide the technical assistance necessary to access the network. King County has provided the Library with copies of a brochure that lists suggested laptop settings to help facilitate access to the wireless network.

We have also added a public Westlaw database subscription to our resources in the RJC Library. This complements our existing Lexis database access. The Westlaw database includes access to case law and statutes for all fifty states, plus federal case law and statutes.

EISIL - Electronic Information System for International Law

There is a great new web site available for those who need to search for international law. The American Society of International Law (ASIL) has developed the Electronic Information System for International Law (EISIL), with the support of the Andrew W. Mellon Foundation. This database helps web searchers locate high quality primary materials, authoritative web sites and helpful research guides for international law on the Internet. EISIL has been designed as an open database of authenticated primary and other materials across the breadth of international law,

which until now have been scattered in libraries, archives and specialized web sites. Users can connect directly to the web resource that interests them by clicking on its title. Thus, if you are looking for a United Nations convention, an international treaty, or any other basic international document, start at this new web site. You can find it at: <http://www.eisil.org/>
