Outgoing and incoming faxes are only \$.50 per page for subscribers and \$1.00 per page for non-subscribers. Fax charges are payable by cash or check upon receipt of a successful transmission report. An additional \$5.00 is charged for long-distance calls. The fax numbers are (206) 205-0513 for the Seattle Library at the King County Courthouse and (206) 205-2905 for the Kent Library at the Regional Justice Center.
